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Best Practice-I

Primary Educational Counseling to Sugarcane
Cutters [Someshwar Sugarcane Industry]

Background

There are 200 sugar factories in Maharashtra. Out of these, around 150 to 170 factories are operational every year. Sugar factories compete with each other to get more quantity of sugarcane to increase their production. Local people don't prefer to work as sugarcane cutters they feel it as a low grade work which is very hectic and which requires more efforts. People from draught prone districts migrate to earn their livelihood. Children attending school also migrate with their parents.

Children of these sugarcane cutters migrate from April to May every year. They reside near sugar factory in a small hut called as 'Khopi'. These children attended school at their hometown but could not continue their schooling because of migration. Earlier sugar factories used to have schools known as 'Sakharshala' at the premises of sugar factory. But due to Education Guarantee Act introduced by the State Government in 2009, these schools have stopped functioning. There are many obstacles in admitting these students in Government or Aided Schools, hence these students remain School dropouts. To include these children in mainstream of education we have joined our hands with TATA Trust and Janseva Gramin Shikshan va Samajik Pratishthan through formal MoU.

For year 2017-18 around 2069 families have migrated in the region of Someshwar sugar factory. In these families around 1711 children (936 girls and 772 boys) have migrated for sugarcane cutting. We have conducted the survey to find out the reasons of why these children do not attend the school.

Following activities are undertaken by AIMS in cooperation with Janseva Gramin Shikshan va Samajik Pratishthan to enroll maximum migrated students in nearby schools.

1. Survey of Schools
2. Survey of Migrated Children
3. Discussion with Parents
4. Admission Fest
5. Recreational Activities for Students.

The detailed description of these activities is mentioned below:

1. Survey of Schools

Survey of schools was essential to enroll migrated children in nearby schools. The shabby look of these children is one of the obstacles in admitting them at schools. Counseling of school authorities & teachers was important to make them available for admission of these students. Around 56 private and public schools were identified in the month of September and interaction was made with school authorities and teachers regarding admission of these migrated students at these schools.

2. Survey of Migrated Children

The data of migrated children from age group 6 to 15 years was required to plan further activities. A survey was conducted in the month of September to know exact count of children who have migrated. Also allied required information like family details, previous school attended problems in attending schools was conducted through this survey. This information was required to overcome the issues faced by these children in attending the School. Their mentality regarding attending the school was also judged during this survey. The survey was conducted in online mode via tab. All migrated students were enrolled in the database so that their progress could be tracked on a daily basis.

3. Discussion with Parents

Many of the parents were reluctant to send their children to schools due to reasons like safety, to take care of younger children in family, filling the water to drink at home, cooking etc. These obstacles were tackled through the discussion with parents. AIMS students interacted with parents and counseled them regarding importance of enrolling children in schools. Precautions



regarding their safety and food were taken care by school and the Trust jointly. Maximum parents were ready to send their child to schools after this activity.

Admission Fest

Common admission fest of these students was conducted to admit these children in identified schools. These children were welcomed at schools by offering books and flowers to make their day memorable and create their interest in attending schools.students were admitted in nearby schools. The responsibility of tracking their daily attendance was assigned to coordinators of Janseva Gramin Shikshan va Samajik Pratishtan. Teaching Faculty of AIMS, Baramati and students actively volunteered this fest.

4. Recreational activities

Children of sugarcane cutters are socially and emotionally deprived. They fear to express their feelings, emotions, thoughts, and abilities due to many reasons. These children undergo a very hectic and compromised lifestyle. To provide a platform to express their emotions, thoughts & skills and to make them relaxed out of their hectic schedule, recreational activities were conducted. Staff members and students of AIMS have conducted activities like Balgeet, Storytelling and outdoor fun games. Also the refreshment was offered by the Institute in the form of Biscuits, Snacks and Chocolates.

Reason for Choice of Best Practices:

Aligned with the Institute's vision, the objective was to work for the socio-economically backward class students. In the same direction, an attempt was made to know the statistics of school dropouts in Baramati taluka. A visit was made to the office of Block Development Officer (BDO) from where the information about school dropouts could be generated. But to our surprise, government records showed sign of no dropouts. It was the BDO then, who directed us to an NGO i.e. Tata Trusts & Janaseva Gramin Vikas Va Shikshan Pratishtan which works for the education of children of sugarcane cutters in Someshwar Sugar Industry, Someshwar. We tried to understand functioning of their work and had a MoU with them. There could be no other better practice than working for the children who remain devoid of education. Hence this practice.

Activity I through MoU: with Janseva Gramin Vikas Va Shikshan Pratisthan

Reasons identified for not attending schools: [Visit at Khopis and Interaction with Laborers and their Children.]

1. Parents are reluctant to send their children because of their child's low IQ.
2. These laborers have to toil on farms at the break of dawn. They doubt the safety of their child if the child is left alone at home. So they take their child along with them to work.
3. Some children especially girls, do not feel comfortable going to school as they do not have footwear, a comb or hair oil to make their hair. Their ragged clothes give them complex issues and make them feel diffident to go to school. They have a fear of getting bullied at school by other local schoolmates.
4. Parents take their child for work as they get money for the work done by the child. But this affects a child's schooling.



If parents are willing to send their ward to school, then there is resistance on part of school authorities to admit them in schools. This reason particularly becomes an important cause of concern. The logic behind this is, school teachers feel that these children belong to a very crude background and so these government teachers do not want to invest their time in making them learn as it will require them to put in extra efforts.

The problems of sugarcane cutters and their children pertaining to attending the school identified in earlier visit were addressed during this visit. We have conducted following activities develop positive mindset of students towards schooling.

1. Introduction of Children:

All students were asked to give their brief introduction, their hobbies, interests and what they want to become in future. During their introduction it is observed out Students were very much positive about their career. They envisages picture of their future career but are not confident about the ways and means to achieve it.

2. Interaction of AIMS Faculty members and MBA students with children:

Our MBA students and faculty members had interaction with these children. To motivate them faculty members and students shared their real life experiences with them.

3. Success Stories:

These children are emotionally deprived, along with other needs motivation and emotional needs are very much important for them. Hence, to motivate them the success stories of successful personalities such as sport persons, politicians, businessman's etc.

4. Recreational Activity: Recreational activities were conducted to to give platform to their talents skills and abilities. Children presented various group and individual activities such as poetry, Dance, storytelling, badbadgeet etc.

5. Counseling of parents: All students and staff members had discussion with parents of these children the importance of attending school was explained to these children.

Overall the visits was very fruitful, all children and parents were happy and were motivated as a result of this activity.


Commencement, Duration, and Termination



